### Membership Transfer

In the event you need to move to another state or country, you can transfer your membership to any of our 290 Junior Leagues throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico and England.

### **Membership Privileges**

New Members have all membership privileges except the ability to hold office or vote. New Members are recognized as Active Members in the JLHR upon completion of their training course.

### **Flexible Membership Point System**

The JLHR operates using a point system in which each member is required to earn 100 points in a league year. Members will have many options to choose from to earn point throughout the year for both required and flexible commitment points. As a member, you have the opportunity to truly design your own membership experience in the League.

# **MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY & OBLIGATIONS**

Women Building Better Communities

# Eligibility

Prospective members shall have reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday at the time of application.

New Members over the age of 37 must remain active at least 4 (four) years before being granted Sustainer status.

A candidate who lives outside the geographic areas of the JLHR may be transferred to the League where she resides as long as she meets all of the eligibility requirements of the JLHR (except the residence/work requirement).

## Membership Obligations: 2016-2017 New Member Class

Membership Responsibilities

- Dues: 2016 2017 annual dues (\$120) payable no later than the October 2016 General Membership Meeting
- New Member Course: Completion of the New Member Course includes submission of a signed New Member Application, Participation in the Mid-Year Survey, and Annual Placement Survey and/or Interview (as implemented by the Nominating and Placement Committee).
- Attendance at 5 of 7 New Member Meetings (NMMs) will earn a total of ten (10) points. (If all 7 meetings are attended, the New Member will earn two (2) additional points per meeting that will be used as flexible commitment points)
- Participation in two (2) New Member class Done-in-a-Day (DIAD) projects will earn a total of ten (10) points. If additional DIAD projects are completed New Members will receive five (5) points for each.
- Training: New Members will participate in at least two (2) training opportunities sponsored by either the Junior League of Hampton Roads (JLHR) or Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI), earning a total of ten (10) points.

Financial Responsibilities

- Publications: New Members will purchase, sell, or donate a minimum of \$60.00 value in JLHR and/or swap publications at In-League pricing, earning a total of ten (10) points.
- JLHR Craft Beer Festival: New Members will work one (1) Craft Beer Festival event shift, earning a total of ten (10) points.
- Touch-A-Truck Event Shift: New Members will work one (1) Touch-A-Truck shift, earning a total of ten (10) points.
- Touch-a-Truck: New Members will purchase, sell, or donate a minimum of four (4) Touch-a-Truck event tickets at In-league pricing (family four pack \$15), earning a total of ten (10) points.

### Flexible Commitment Choices

In addition to the specified Membership and Financial Obligations, New Members will earn an additional minimum of thirty (30) points from the list of Flexible Commitment Choices. The New Member Co-Chairs will review the menu of options available for new members to earn these Flexible Commitment Points during the New Member Course.

- 1. The prospective New Member is responsible for completing the JLHR Membership Application with signature of commitment. These forms need to be submitted by October 12, 2016.
- 2. Accept / Decline invitation of membership to New Member Committee Co-Chairs by October 12, 2016 to Junior League Headquarters (729 Thimble Shoals Blvd Suite 4D, Newport News, VA 23606 or by emailing newmember@JLHamptonRoads.org). If accepting the invitation, include your dues payment with your acceptance (checks made payable to JLHR). Dues payment must be made no later than the October General Membership Meeting (October 26, 2016).
- It is the prospective member's responsibility to be aware of the obligations of membership, including attendance requirements for general membership meetings, financial obligations (including dues and fund raisers), and requirements of the New Member Course. Prospective Members should discuss and questions or concerns about these obligations with the New Member Co-Chairs, Kim Gibbs and Harper Lewis (newmember@JLHamptonRoads.org).
- 4. Attend New Member Kick Off on Saturday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> from 9:30a.m. to 11:30a.m. at Junior League Headquarters. This morning will include community building, learning about the League, answering any additional questions you may have, and more. Light refreshments will be provided.
